Our topic this Half Term is In The Forest. To complement this work we would like you to do a mini topic at home all about your garden.

Here are some key questions for you to help start your investigations.



- What does your garden look like? Draw a map or plan of your garden like this.
- What grows in your garden? You could do some leaf rubbings or press some flowers.
