Although the final newsletter of last year was published shortly before the end of term we have lots of things to celebrate:

Early Years End of Year Celebration - Every child got to invite 2 adults to celebrate their first year in school. As proms had been cancelled we performed all our songs as well as a few favourites from over the year. Over afternoon tea children got to share their learning journey folder with their adults. All children were presented with a Mr Men or Little Miss Book that reflected them and in which class teachers had written a personal message.

Lower School Splash Day - 150 children had fun splashing about in the water. Mrs Jones had too much fun with the hose!!!! If they didn't fancy getting wet we had slime, Gellibaff, and bubbles to play with. Once we were back in dry clothes there was hot chocolate for everyone to enjoy.

Our **Modern Foreign Languages Day** was a great way to experience a taste of different cultures from around the world with each year group celebrating the following countries:

Fun Friday was just epic. Every child got to spend 1 hour on the inflatables, decorate a biscuit and visit the Picknalls ice cream parlour. We also managed to raise a further £234.

A **team of decorators** have been extremely busy painting every classroom.

We were successful in receiving nearly £400,000 to **update the electric supply** throughout the school.

A **new sound system** has been installed in the hall including microphones.

Every Key Stage has its own **portable sound system** which expands the range of possibility for outdoor teaching.

And, of course, we are extremely proud of our new, **all singing, all dancing Early Years playground**.



We do not intend to stop there as this year will see further updates to the Key Stage 2 mobiles, new Key Stage 1 and 2 trim trails installed, the children's toilets will be upgraded and we are very excited to be finalising plans for the purchase of our very first Picknalls mini-bus!

All of this year's fundraising will go towards supporting these projects and we are sure you will agree with us that every one will enhance our school and benefit everyone.



School Arrangements

Staggered start and finish times – We use staggered timings to minimise the numbers of families on site at any one time, to support the use of the leisure centre car park and keep the arrival/departure process calm and safe for children. **Please only arrive on site between your child's allocated times and not before:**

Nursery session times are not compulsory therefore if you have siblings higher up the school you are able to drop off/collect at the sibling's time if required.

Please arrive during your **10-minute time slot** only and no earlier. If you have siblings in other year groups, please arrive at the end of the first slot which will mean you are on time for the second slot. Anyone arriving before their time slot will still be required to queue at the appropriate gate listed above. Children who arrive late must be brought up to the main reception to be signed in. Children must be brought directly to their child's gate by a parent or carer and must not be left to walk unsupervised up the lane, dropped off at the first large gate or left at the entrance to the school and come up the drive unsupervised. Similarly, parents/carers must be on the playground to collect at the end of the school day. **We cannot allow children to walk unsupervised** to the main gates to meet parents. Children are the responsibility of the school only when they have entered the gates on to the playground. We are not responsible for children walking down the lane or onto the car park. Finally, dogs are not to be brought on site or tied to the main gate and left unattended.

Leisure Centre Parking

We are very fortunate to be able to use the Uttoxeter Leisure Centre (ULC) carpark for free at the beginning and end of school times.

The **agreed times** for use are:

8.20am-9.15am

3.10pm-3.45pm

If you need to use the Leisure Centre carpark at any other time of day you must obtain a ticket from one of the machines.

Unfortunately, we often receive reports of cars being left outside of designated spaces and causing unnecessary blockages. As we've already mentioned above, **please arrive during your 10 minute staggered slot** and help lessen congestion, pollution and stress!



Flu Vaccination

On Monday 16th October 2023 all children from Reception to Year 4 will have the opportunity to receive their annual flu vaccination administered by the School Age Immunisation Service (SAIS).

You should have recently received an email about this with an attached letter including further information and a link to their [online consent form](#) which must be completed by 10am on Friday 13th October in order for your child to receive their vaccine.

Happy Hours

Happy Hours are situated in the Treetops building at the top of our school drive. They provide before and after school child care and run a holiday club during most of the school holidays for 3-12 year olds.

Their opening times during term time are:

7:00am—start of school

End of school—6:00pm

Please remember that as they are a separate facility to the school we can't take bookings or check if your child is on their register at anytime.

Please speak to them directly to register your child and you will then be able to book your childcare sessions online here.

Bookings must be made online at least 24 hours in advance.

Cost of Living

The [Household Support](#) scheme has been extended until 31st March 2024. Families can apply once in any round. The rounds are 1st April-30th September and then 1st October-31st March. Households which qualify would benefit from a £65.00 supermarket voucher and £20.00 per additional dependant.

HOUSEHOLD SUPPORT FUND EXTENDED

This may include, but is not limited to, residents of Staffordshire who are entitled to but not claiming qualifying benefits, people who are claiming Housing Benefit and a range of low-income households in need including children of all ages, pensioners, unpaid carers, care leavers and disabled people. We can apply on behalf of anyone who requests it so please come and speak to us.

We are once again thrilled with the number of applications we received for Nursery and Reception places for this academic year.

The 60 places available in Reception had record oversubscription with 117 families nominating us in their choices and Nursery is at capacity with 52 children on roll.

SIMS Parent

When you completed your child's admission form prior to joining the school you will have been asked to prioritise the order of contacts to receive regular communications from the school.



Whichever person you name as **Priority 1** will receive emails and texts from us using the information you have provided us with, therefore, it is vital that you keep this up-to-date. If you need to change contact details you can contact the office or use [SIMS Parent](#), which you received a link to when your child was first admitted.

If you would like to another contact to also receive texts and emails please speak to the office.

Free Milk

All children under 5 are entitled to a free drink of milk every day they are in school. If you would like your child to continue to receive daily milk after their 5th birthday you can pay every half term through ParentPay. Please contact the office for more information.



School Dinners

The cost of school meals continues to be £2.83. this is applicable to Key Stage 2 (Year 3 and 4) pupils not in receipt of income based Free School Meals (see below).

We are very pleased to introduce our new catering firm [Edwards and Ward](#) who will provide our lunch time meals from this term onwards. Their [current menu](#) is available on our website.

DIETARY REQUIREMENTS

If your child has special dietary requirements due to a diagnosed allergy, intolerance or medical condition you will need to register directly with Edwards and Ward using their [online form](#). please see their [FAQ page](#) for more information.

BOOKING MEALS

It is extremely important that you remember to pre-book your child's lunches using [ParentPay](#). During registration at the beginning of every day two registers are taken, one for attendance and one for meals. These are then sent to the school office and Mrs Simon must check through both of them every morning before she can let the kitchen staff know what they need to prepare.

A lot of time is wasted when a child's meal hasn't been pre-booked and if she has to deal with several cases every morning this causes a delay for the kitchen.

ParentPay

Attendance

Being part of a [Multi-Academy Trust](#) we must work with an external Educational Welfare Officer (EWO), who regularly visits our school to monitor the [attendance](#) of all pupils. We have to record absences as being either authorised or unauthorised. If a child falls below 97% attendance this triggers our system to automatically generate a letter of notice. The wording of the letter is generic and doesn't take any personal circumstances into account.

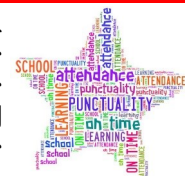
If you receive a letter notifying you that your child's attendance has fallen below 97% it doesn't mean that you are about to be issued with a Penalty Notice but if you have any concerns please speak to Mrs Tapp or ask to make an appointment with the EWO, Marie Steventon.

Please remember to inform us when your child is absent from school for any reason, such as:

- Absence due to illness etc
- Planned late arrival
- Medical appointments during school time (please include supporting documents)
- Different to normal pick up arrangements (except booking into Happy Hours)

Free School Meals

Parents claiming some benefits can claim free school meals for any of their children who are registered at a Staffordshire school and who would normally be at school at lunch time. This is separate from the [Universal Free School Meals](#) which all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children are automatically entitled to.

School meals are a good way to ensure that your child eats well at lunchtime and you can save yourself time and money.

Even if you don't want your children to have the meals, claiming them helps their school. The more eligible parents who claim meals, the more funding the school receives.

The current entitlement criteria are as follows -

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance. Please note the 'new style' job seekers allowance is not a qualifying benefit, as this is based upon payment of National Insurance contributions and not the household income
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance. Please note the 'new style' employment and support allowance is not a qualifying benefit, as this is based upon payment of National Insurance contributions and not the household income
- eligible for Child Tax Credit but not Working Tax Credit and the household income (as used by HMRC to assess tax credits) is not more than £16,190. Please note: anyone eligible for Working Tax Credit, or if you have a partner and they receive it, regardless of Income, you will not qualify
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- In receipt of the 4 week run on of working tax credit (this is where someone becomes unemployed or reduces their hours and so is no longer entitled to working tax credit but will continue to receive it for a further 4 weeks and is entitled to free meals during that time)
- Universal credit (provided you have an annual net earned household income of no more than £7,400 as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods). Your net earned income is your household income after taxes and deductions and does not include income from Universal Credit or any other benefits you may receive.

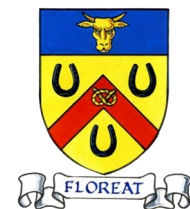


