

# First Aid Update

As a result of a recent training course, we have been asked to remind parents of the importance to reduce the risk of choking by cutting grapes into quarters if they are sent in as part of their child's packed lunch. This is particularly important if your child is under 5 years as young children have small airways, may not have developed their back teeth and are still learning to chew food properly. ## Defibrillator

We would like to make everyone aware that we have a defibrillator on site which is accessible to anyone in the event of an emergency.

It is located on the wall next to the main entrance and has the entry code on the side.

Having access to defibrillators in school drastically increases the chance of pupils, teachers and visitors surviving a cardiac arrest.

# Admissions September 2024

#### Reception and Middle School



Applications for Reception and Middle School places from September 2024 open during the half term holiday on Wednesday 1st November 2023 and close on 15th January 2024.

Residents in Staffordshire will need to apply through Staffordshire County Council Admissions, use this link for more information. The easiest way to do this is online when application process is open.

#### Nursery

Applications for Nursery places from September 2024 open on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2024.

Nursery applications must be made directly through the school and anyone wishing to apply can register their interest to do so before the 16th January. We will add you to our waiting list and then send details on how to apply once the process begins.

Nursery, Reception and Middle school parents are informed of the outcome after 16th April 2024.

# **Emergency Closure Procedure**

Our weather has been pretty unpredictable recently so we thought you may like to know our **Emergency** Closure Procedure

If after <mark>severe weather</mark> it looks as if staff from outlying areas will have <mark>difficulty in getting to school</mark> a decision to close the school will be made as quickly as possible by the Headteacher and Chair of Governors. This decision will be made after consultation with other local schools.

- Closure will be the last resort
- A notice will be posted on the school website
- Priority one parents will be made aware of the closure via text message from Teachers 2 Parents' (Please make sure we have up to date mobile phone details)
- The Staffordshire County Council School Closure list will be updated
- Parents can sign up on the Staffordshire County Council website for free email or text message alerts

#### EARLY CLOSURE

If the school has to close early — due to a breakdown of the heating system, flooding, emergency etc., a decision to close the school early will be made by the Headteacher with the approval of the Chair of Governors and the ULT.

As many parents as possible will be contacted.

Parents are requested to consider this possibility and make the school aware of alternative arrangements should they be unable to take their children home themselves.

No child will be sent home unaccompanied.

# Flu Vaccination

If your child has not received their flu vaccination either in school or from their GP surgery you can now book your child into one of the School Age Immunisation Service's community flu vaccination clinics.



# Help Get Extra Funding for Our School

Did you know that we can receive extra funding to support eligible families? Some of the funding can be used to directly help those families pay for school trips, uniform, and peripatetic music lessons, please speak to the office to discuss the options. We also use the funding to help accelerate progress and raise the attainment of all our pupils throughout the school. Specifically, in the previous academic year, the money was used to purchase extra resources and training including an extra class set of iPads, additional hours for school staff to provide small group interventions, intervention resources and Little Wandle training for staff. You can see a breakdown of how we used the income on our Pupil Premium page on the school website.

#### How do we receive Pupil Premium funding?

Families who are eligible to receive funding include:

- Service children use the link to check the criteria and notify us if you are eligible.
- Looked after children including children who are (or have been) adopted, fostered or subject to a child arrangement order. You will need to complete a form and provide evidence of relevant documents to verify the child's status.
- <u>Families in receipt of certain benefits</u> you can check if you are eligible and apply online. You don't need to provide paper evidence and you only need to apply once.
- Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) is extra funding that is available to support eligible 3 and 4 year olds who access the universal 15 funded hours per week completing you Parent Declaration form will allow us to claim on your behalf if you are eligible.

Please use the links above for more information and please consider applying if you fit any of the criteria.

We understand that some parents may be put off from applying for many reasons but please be reassured that your claim will be treated confidentially and your child will not be singled out or treated any differently to their peers.

Even if you don't want your children to have the meals, claiming them helps the school. The more eligible parents who claim meals, the more funding the school receives.




#### Mini-bus

## **Communication with Teachers**




















# Let us know if you're in financial difficulty

We know that many families are going through a tough time financially and we want to do everything we can to help you and your child. If you're struggling with your finances, please get in touch to let us know, as there may be things we can suggest which will help.

In the meantime here are some things you may find useful:

#### Citizen's Advice Bureau (CAB)

You don't have to be a UK citizen to get support from your local CAB, you just need to be a resident of the local area. The CAB can help you with:

- Getting benefits or organising other financial support
- Accessing support for essential costs (food, bills, rent)

#### Family Hub

Contact your local <u>Family Hub</u> to get help accessing all the support you might need as a family. Find your local hub here Evergreen, 42 Kingshurst Way, Birmingham, B37 6DX

#### Check you're paying the right amount of tax

Make sure you're on the right tax code. If you aren't you might be due a refund. Use the  $\underline{\text{Money}}$  Saving Expert's free tax code calculator to find out.



#### Claim any benefits you're entitled to

Use one of these benefits calculators to determine whether there are any benefits you could be claiming:

#### Turn2us

#### Policy in Practice

Support for <u>migrant families</u> — <u>use this calculator</u> if you are a migrant family, or if you have no recourse to public funds (meaning you're not entitled to the majority of welfare benefits)

TURN2US

You may be able to get benefits paid early if you need cash urgently — this is known **FIGHTING UK POVERTY** as 'a short-term benefit advance'. You will need to contact the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) office at Burton On Trent Jobcentre, Crown House, New Street, Burton on Trent, Staffordshire, DE14 3SN or whoever is dealing with your claim.

#### Check you've received all the government's cost-of-living payments

The government's <u>cost-of-living payments</u> are available for those receiving certain benefits or tax credits. You don't need to apply for these — if you're eligible the money should go straight into your account.

If you think you're due a payment but haven't received one, report a missing payment to the government here.

Be aware of scams! If you receive any emails, texts or phone calls asking you to fill in an application form or asking for your bank details to receive a cost-of-living payment, do not talk to them or send a reply. Get more information on <a href="cost-of-living scams">cost-of-living scams</a> on the Money Saving Expert's website.

#### Find out what help you can get with your energy bills

Take a look at these resources from the British Gas Energy Trust and the Money Saving Expert.

#### Check if your child is entitled to free school meals (FSM)

If your child is eligible for FSM you need to get them registered. This will allow them to get a free meal at school, and we'll get extra funding (known as the pupil premium) to support your child's learning.

Go to this <u>Staffordshire County Council website page</u> to check if your child is eligible. If they are, or if you're not sure, linsert details of how your school can help, and how parents can register their child as entitled to FSM at your school. If you are eligible you can <u>apply online here</u>

#### See what other support you can get from your local authority

Staffordshire County Council's Household Support Fund aims to help families experiencing hardship particularly those who may not be eligible for other government support that has been made available but nevertheless still in need of financial assistance. Each eligible household will benefit from a ££65.00 supermarket voucher and a further £20.00 supermarket voucher per additional dependant. This may include, but is not limited to, residents who are entitled to but not claiming qualifying benefits, people who are claiming Housing Benefit and a range of low-income households in need, including children of all ages, pensioners, unpaid carers, care leavers and disabled people.





Other local schemes that you might be eligible for:

The Holiday Activities and Food Programme — access to food and activities over the school holidays. Note that if your child is eligible for free school meals (see above), they'll also qualify for this programme

Here to help - cost of living support - Staffordshire County Council — On these pages you'll find information, advice, and support to help you manage cost of living pressures.

<u>Help for Households</u> - Get government cost of living support — Government website to see what cost of living support you could be eligible for.

#### Get free or low-cost food

If you're worried about not having enough food to feed your family, you're not alone. There are a number of places offering support.

If you have a child under 4, and meet the eligibility criteria, you may be entitled to <u>healthy start</u> food vouchers

Find your local food bank here: <u>Bankuet</u>, <u>The Independent Food Aid Network</u>, the <u>Trussell Trust</u>, or your local community fridge

Use food waste apps and websites like Olio (for free food and household items from your local community), Too Good To Go (for low-cost food from local restaurants), or Low Price Foods (food that has passed its best before date, but is still safe to eat)

Become a member of a community shop. These organisations sell food to their members at a reduced price. Some shops are free to join if you meet certain criteria, and others ask for a small contribution. Find out if there's one near you by checking these websites: Community Shop, Your Local Pantry, Community Grocery

# Nursery

If you pay for Nursery hours using National Savings vouchers via HMRC please ensure you inform the office every time you make a payment with the following information:

- National Savings Voucher used
- The amount owed
- The date the voucher was issued
- The value of the voucher

#### Increasing Nursery Hours

Once our Nursery children have had a couple of months to settle in we have found that parents often ask to increase their hours. If you wish to add extra sessions you please inform the office so that we can ensure adequate staffing ratios are in place.













# Remember, Remember Celebrate Bonfire Night Safely.

#### The Firework Code

Fireworks are explosives and potentially dangerous, so they need careful handling and storage.

- Only buy fireworks that are CE marked.
- Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- Keep fireworks in a closed box.
- Follow the instructions on each firework.
- Light them at arms' length, using a taper.
- Stand well back.
- Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off it could still explode.
- Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them.
- Always supervise children around fireworks.
- Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- Never give sparklers to a child under five.
- Keep pets indoors.
- Don't set off noisy fireworks late at night and never after 11pm.



## Sparkler safety tips

- These are often viewed as harmless but they do burn at fierce temperatures and can easily cause injuries.
- Light sparklers one at a time.
- Supervise children with sparklers and never give them to children under five.
- Make sure everyone handling sparklers wears gloves.
- Hold sparklers at arm's length while being lit.
- Don't wave sparklers about close to other people.
- · Never hold a baby in your arms while you are holding a sparkler.
- When you have finished with the sparkler put it in a bucket of cold water.

Massive well done to our Year 4 pupils at the Boccia Tournament, Robert Sutton, last night. Some great bowling and singing on the way home!














