# Nursery - Spring 1 Jan/Feb 2024

English — This half term we will be focussing on the foundations of literacy. At Picknalls we follow the Little Wandle programme, and we will be looking particularly at Phase One. Children need to be secure in this before they move onto letter sound acquisition during phase 2. Sing every day... Why not make a singing apron or bag?



In a pocket/in the bag place an item from a nursery rhyme e.g. a bus for wheels on the bus, a star for twinkle twinkle, a green bottle for 10 green bottles, the list is endless. Perhaps you could try and sing 5 nursery rhymes a day every day. Children who can here the rhythm and rhyme in

these songs often become the very best readers.

A listening moment. This is an activity that can take place indoors or outdoors. Remind your child how to be a good listener and invite them to show how good they



are at listening by remembering all the sounds they hear when they listen for a moment. It may be useful to use a sand timer to illustrate, for example, the passing of half a minute. Ask them what made each sound and encourage them to try to make the sound themselves. You might like to share this read aloud book all about a listening walk.

Drum outdoors.

Give your child a beater or make drumsticks, for example from short pieces of dowel. Encourage



your child to explore an outdoor space and discover how different sounds are made by tapping or stroking, with their beaters, a wooden door, a wire fence, a metal slide, and items such as pipes and upturned pots. Why not record/photograph your child and share their music making with us.

Rhyming books
Regularly include
rhyming books as part of
your daily book-sharing
session. Read these
books with plenty of
intonation and
expression so that your
child tunes into the
rhythm of the language



and the rhyming words. Encourage your child to join in with repetitive phrases such as Run, run, as fast as you can, You can't catch me, I'm the Gingerbread Man. Wherever possible make the activity multi-sensory to intensify learning and enjoyment.

Sounds around

Make sure that word play with initial sounds is commonplace. Include lots of simple tongue twisters to ensure that your child enjoys experimenting with words that are alliterative. Use opportunities as they occur incidentally to make up tongue twisters by using children's names, or objects that are of particular



personal interest to them (e.g. David's dangerous dinosaur, Millie's marvellous, magic mittens).



Digging for treasure Collect two sets of objects suitable for hiding in sand or shaving foam. Each set of objects must


have names beginning with the same initial sound. Choose initial sounds for each set that sound very different from one another. Bury the objects in preparation for the session. As your child uncovers the treasure, group the objects by initial sound and each time another is added recite the content of that set: Wow! You have found a car. Now we have a cup, a cow, a candle and a car.

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Maths – This half term we will be looking at the numbers 6 to 10. Counting to 10 and writing the numbers to 5 then 10. We will also look at ordering things by size as part of our Goldilocks and the Three Bears week.



Draw out a worm and divide his body into 11 segments. Label each segment from 0 to 10. Ask you child to stick stickers in the segment to match the numeral.



On a large piece of paper or cardboard draw a scarf or race-track shape. Divide into segments and put a number from 1 to 10 in each segment. Take it in turns to roll a dice and say the number you land on. Collect that many Lego bricks, raisins etc and keep them in a

pile. Once you have all crossed the finish line count your objects. The winner is the one with the most.

Find 3 Teddy's. A small, a medium and a large. Next find a selection of objects in three different sizes for your child to match to the right bear.



Find a selection of objects but in different sizes and then arrange them from smallest to largest. Start with 3, small, medium and large, then gradually increase the quantity as your child becomes more confident.





Draw carefully round your child's hands to create glove or mitten templates. Write a number from 1 to 10 on each glove and then provide stickers, buttons etc for decorating. Children need to say the number on the mitten and then decorate using that many stickers etc.

Count out 11 cake cases. In the bottom write the numbers 0 to 10. Provide your child with a pile of small objects e.g. pom poms, mini marshmallows, skittles, raisins etc. Ask your child to say the number then carefully count out the corresponding number of objects. If you



want to make this a fine motor activity as well add a pair of tweezers or chopsticks to move the objects.
