## Geography

This half term, we will be focussing human and physical features in Uttoxeter. We will be finding out and comparing human and physical features and creating simple maps including different features on these.

# Art


This half term we will be working with paint. We will be focussing on colour mixing and warm and cold colours. We will be studying the work and style of Paul Klee.

### Music.

## Maths

This half term, we will be looking at place value within 20. Children will understand the teen numbers and different ways of representing them. The children will compare and order numbers within 20 and be able to use a number line to 20. Towards the end of the half term we will look at number bonds to 20 and doubling numbers.
