At Picknalls First School, our intent for Writing is to foster a love for language and communication, enabling all pupils to become confident and proficient writers across a range of genres. We aim to provide a curriculum that is rich, engaging, and inclusive, promoting creativity and critical thinking skills in our young learners. Our intention is to develop pupils' ability to express themselves fluently, coherently, and accurately, whilst instilling a lifelong passion for writing.

Implementation

<u>Curriculum Design</u>

Nursery

Our nursery provision enables children to learn the essential pre-writing skills they need to develop as they progress through the school. Fine and gross motor skills are imperative, as are speaking and listening too.

Reception

Reception incorporate elements of Drawing Club. The pupils embrace being part of the imaginative club together to motivate them to write and enjoy the process. As their phonics knowledge builds so does their writing too.

Year 1

Year 1 incorporate elements of Curious Quests. The children are excited to write and explore their skills with the characters from the Curious Quests. Whilst focusing on the National Curriculum objectives. Again, as their phonics develops so does their writing.

Year 2

Year 2 begin the journey to writing units. They focus on writing to entertain and to inform. These key writing elements can be developed throughout the year being repeated and progressed through their vocabulary and grammar too. We focus on exposing the pupils to write for a range of audiences and purposes.

Year 3 and 4

Pupils continue their journey with writing units and introduce the skills of writing to persuade. Again, we repeat and expose the pupils to a range of audiences and purposes. We ensure their vocabulary, punctuation and grammar objectives are taught through the units too.

Our Writing curriculum is carefully designed to ensure progression and coherence from EYFS to Key Stage 2, offering a balanced blend of explicit instruction, guided practice, and independent application. We incorporate a variety of genres, text types, and stimuli to inspire and challenge pupils' writing skills. Teachers plan engaging activities that cater to the diverse needs of learners, including those with SEN or EAL, supporting every child to reach their full potential.

High-Quality Teaching

Teachers are highly skilled in delivering effective writing lessons, employing a range of strategies to develop pupils' writing competencies. They provide clear modelling, constructive feedback, and targeted support to enhance pupils' understanding and application of writing conventions.
